Burning rubber on the streets of Cyberjaya

Motorsports fans enjoy a day of thrills ahead of F1 weekend

- VEN before F1 drivers could burn rubber in Sepang next month, motorsport fans are already behind the wheel in Cyberjaya.

A line-up of two and four-wheeled action which included mini bike-racing, go-karting, radio-controlled drifting and drifting, was enough to give the 200+ participants and their supporters all the fun they needed. The go-kart race in the afternoon was part of the many activities held in conjunction with the annual Cyberjaya Motorsports event.

The mini-bike race which kicked off the day's competition saw mad Faisal Mohd Akhir emerge as champion, taking home RM700 in prize money. He was followed by Shamsyrazal Sumning second spot and Muhammad A Hasbullah in third place, while Mohd Hazrul Husbullah dominated the RC drifting, collecting RM900 in prize money.

The action, which started in the late evening, continued into the night and at midnight Mohd Kairul Anuar emerged as the clear winner, followed by Mohd Nazam Shah Sulaiman and Mohd Aslin.

which saw heavily-modified makes including a Nissan Skyline GTR34, Mazda RX-7 FC3S, Toyota KE17, Nissan S15, and Cefiro A31 competing in tandem face-offs on the 450m track.

Kumeres Mikmathyalagan set the pace at the go-kart circuit by clocking the fastest time followed closely by Dominic Benzi in second place and Timothy Hardie Keit in third place. Cyberview Sdn Bhd (CSB) managing director Hafidz Hashim said this was the second time the event was being held at the Community Clubhouse premises where the track is much longer.
